



Daily Cleaning

For everyday upkeep, wipe with a damp microfibre cloth or a soft sponge. Warm water is usually sufficient for both powder coated and raw brushed stainless steel surfaces.

Removing Stains & Dirt

For stubborn marks or build-up, use a mild, pH-neutral soap solution.

Gently wipe the surface—do not scrub aggressively.

Raw Brushed Stainless Steel - wipe in the direction of the grain to maintain an even finish.

Powder Coated - use light pressure to protect the textured coating surface.

After Cleaning

Rinse thoroughly with clean water to remove any soap residue, then dry with a soft cloth. This helps prevent streaking, water marks, and fine surface scratches—especially in bathrooms where mineral deposits are common.

Pay Attention To

Pay close attention to edges, joints, and inside corners, as this is where moisture and cleaning residue can collect. A quick final wipe in these areas keeps the piece looking clean and refined.

What to Avoid

To protect both finishes, avoid:

Abrasive cleaners, scouring pads, and steel wool

Harsh chemical cleaners (strong solvents, bleach/chlorine-based products, or acidic cleaners)

Leaving cleaning products sitting on the surface—always rinse and dry

Protect From Moisture

Standing or stagnant water on metal can leave marks and may cause damage over time. Remove pooled water promptly and dry the surface, particularly after cleaning or heavy use.

Preventive Care

Avoid sharp objects, dragging items across the surface, or heavy impact. Scratches and dents may affect the appearance and can lead to additional wear over time.

Please Note

Stainless steel needs little, yet gives much. Over time, small marks, fine scratches, and a natural patina may develop, especially on raw brushed stainless. These are not flaws, but signs of use that add quiet character. With simple care, the surface stays clean and refined, while aging beautifully in its own way.
